#### **Annual Events**

- On New Year's Day in Carmel CA, we provide communications for the <u>Rio Resolution Run</u>, an alternative to football games and drinking profusely.
- In late March we provide backcountry communications for the Sea Otter Mountain Bike Classic on the old Fort Ord.
- The first Tuesday in April is a statewide earthquake drill, and we provide communication support to the City of Pacific Grove.
- Winding up Highway One south of Carmel, the <u>Big Sur Marathon</u> in April is NPSARC's most challenging communications event.
- In May, we provide emergency communications during the <u>Monterey County</u> <u>Special Olympics</u> at Monterey Peninsula College.
- Amateur Radio's yearly test of 24-hour emergency communications, <u>Field</u> <u>Day</u>, last year at Fremont Peak State Park in June.
- The Monterey County Fire Training Officers request our communications assistance during Fire School on Fort Hunter Liggett (contact Jeff <u>N6GAI</u> for more information).
- The City of Monterey requests our skills during the parade and fireworks display for their Fourth of July.
- At the end of July comes the <u>Feast of Lanterns</u> in Pacific Grove.



- In September, Lover's Point is the site for the <u>Triathalon at Pacific Grove</u> and then the 10 km <u>Run For</u> <u>The Beacon</u>.
- Each October, Amateur Radio operators participate in a scenario involving a major disaster in their area, or a Simulated Emergency Test, or <u>SET</u>.
- The Velo Club of Monterey tours the Monterey Bay in October with our help in the annual <u>Ride Around</u> <u>The Bay</u>.
- Amateur Radio is in tune for the Pacific Grove Marching Band Festival.
- Finishing the year, we join Pacific Grove on Candy Cane Lane to bring in the Christmas season.

# **Public Service**

- Amateur Radio Emergency Services <u>ARES</u>, serving cities and disaster relief agencies around the Monterey Peninsula.
- ARES at the <u>National Weather Service</u>, a full-service amateur radio station for disemination of weather data during telecommunications emergencies.
- Military Affiliate Radio System <u>MARS</u>, passing messages from ship to shore via dedicated civilians and retired military.
- National Traffic System <u>NTS</u>, sending and accepting outgoing welfare messages from inside disaster areas.
- Amateur License Examinations for all range of license classes -- morse code and written exams.
- Free amateur radio <u>classes</u> for all interested people held every Tuesday evening at the Naval Postgraduate School.
