



REAR ADMIRAL THOMAS A. MERCER Superintendent Naval Postgraduate School

Rear Admiral Mercer graduated with distinction from the U.S. Naval Academy in 1962. He was designated as a Naval Aviator in February 1964. After A-4C training, he reported to VA-172 for a three year tour which included two Mediterranean cruises and one Southeast Asia combat deployment aboard USS FRANKLIN D. ROOSEVELT (CVA 42). He then attended the Naval Postgraduate School at Monterey, California and was awarded a Master of Science Degree in Aeronautical Engineering in 1969.

After A-7E training, he reported to VA-195 where he made two combat deployments to Southeast Asia aboard USS KITTY HAWK (CVA 63). Following a shore touras the Light Attack Placement Officer at the Bureau of Naval Personnel, he joined VA-82 as Executive Officer in July 1975. He assumed command of VA-82 in November 1976 while embarked aboard the USS NIMITZ during her first Mediterranean deployment.

In July 1979 he was assigned as the Executive Officer of the USS Enterprise (CVN 65) after completing naval nuclear power training. He assumed command of USS GUADALCANAL (LPH 7) in September 1981 and then command of USS CARL VINSON (CVN 70) in July 1983 as her second commanding officer. While commanding CARL VINSON, he completed two WESTPAC deployments. In March 1986, he detached from USS CARL VINSON and was promoted to Rear Admiral. He was assigned as Deputy Director for Command, Control, and Communications (J-6), in the organization of the Joint Chiefs of Staff and subsequently became the Vice Director of Operational Plans and Interoperability (J-7 JCS). He assumed command of Carrier Group SEVEN in June 1988 annd flew his flag as commander of the Nimitz, Midway, and Ranger battle groups. He assumed the duties of CINCPACREP Philippines and Commander, U.S. Naval Forces, Philippines in July 1990 and remained in command through the Subic Facility disestablishment on 24 November 1992. Rear Admiral Mercer was assigned as the Superintendent, Naval Postgraduate School in January, 1993.

Rear Admiral Mercer's awards include the Defense Distinguished Service Medal, Distinguished Service Medal, Defense Superior Service Medal, Legion of Merit (two awards), Distinguished Flying Cross (three awards), four individual Air Medals. 25 Strike Flight Air Medals (255 Vietnam Missions), and six Navy Commendation Medals. He has logged over 3,500 hours in the A-4C and A-7E aircraft and has made over 970 carrier landings.

Rear Admiral Mercer is the son of Captain and Mrs. Willoughby Mercer, USN (ret). He and his wife, Becky, reside at the Naval Postgraduate School, Monterey, California. Tom, a SH-60B pilot, is currently at Test Pilot School in Patuxent River. Their son Bill, is a surface warfare officer assigned aboard USS BELKNAP (CG-26).



VICE ADMIRAL DAVID B. ROBINSON Commander, Naval Surface Force, U.S. Pacific Fleet

Vice Admiral Robinson is a native of Texas and attended Texas A&M University before entering the United States Naval Academy. He was commissioned an Ensign in 1963.

He first went to sea in USS STORMES (DD 780) as the Main Propulsion Assistant and then Damage Control Assistant. This tour was followed by a tour as Engineer Officer in USS ROWAN (DD 782). Subsequently he was the Executive Officer in USS DALE (CG 19).

His sea commands have been USS CANON (PG 90), USS READY (PG 87), USS LUCE (DDG 38), USS RICHMOND K. TURNER (CG 20) and COMMANDER, CRUISER DESTROYER GROUP EIGHT embarked on USS THEODORE ROOSEVELT (CVN 71). During his tour THEODORE ROOSEVELT Battle Group Commander he assumed additional duties as Commander, Battle Force Sixth Fleet in the Mediterranean Sea.

Ashore, Vice Admiral Robinson has served as the Administrative Aide to the Chairman of the Joint Chiefs of Staff; Surface Commander Assignment Officer; Director, Fiscal Management and Procedural Control Division for the Naval Military Personnel Command; Chief of Staff, Commander Surface Force, U.S. Atlantic Fleet; Executive Assistant and Senior Aide to the Vice Chief of Naval Operations; Director, Surface Warfare Manpower and Training Requirements Division (OP-39); Director, Surface Warfare Division (OP-32); Director, Operational Plans and Interoperability, Joint Staff (J-7); and the Deputy and Chief of Staff, U.S. Pacific Fleet.

He has earned a Master of Physics in Oceanography from the U.S. Naval Postgraduate School and is a graduate of the Foreign Service Institute's Executive Seminar in National and International Affairs.

Vice Admiral Robinson assumed his duties as Commander, Naval Surface Force, U.S. Pacific Fleet in April of 1993.

Vice Admiral Robinson's personal decorations include the Navy Cross, Defense Distinguished Service Medal, Distinguished Service Medal, Legion of Merit (five awards), Bronze Star with combat "V", Meritorious Service Medal and Purple Heart.

He is married to the former Gene Kirkpatrick of Denton, Texas. They have two sons, Kirk and David.

DR. HARRISON SHULL Provost Naval Postgraduate School

Harrison Shull was born in Princeton, New Jersey in 1923. He attended Princeton University, majoring in chemistry and received the degree of Bachelor of Arts with highest honors in 1943.

From 1943-1945 he was employed at the U.S. Naval Research Laboratory, Washington, D.C. ultimately serving as Ensign, USNR.

From 1945-1948 he attended the University of California, Berkeley where he received the Ph.D. in Physical Chemistry.

In 1949 he joined the staff of Iowa State University as an Assistant Professor of Chemistry and an Associate Professor and Research Professor of Chemistry; Acting Chairman of the Chemistry Department; Director, Research Computing Center, Acting Dean of Facilities, Acting Dean, College of Arts and Sciences; Dean, Graduate School and Vice-Chancellor, Research & Development.



From 1979 to 1982 he was on the faculty if Rensselaer Polytechnic Institute in Troy, New Jersey serving as Professor of Chemistry; Vice President for Academic Affairs and Provost. From 1982 to 1988 he was at the University of Colorado, Boulder serving as Professor of Chemistry and as Chancellor from 1982 to 1985. In July 1988 he joined the Naval Postgraduate School as Provost and Academic Dean.

He is an honorary member of the National Academy of Sciences; the Royal Academy if Arts and Sciences of Uppsala; Fellow, American Association for the Advancement of Science; Phi Beta Kappa; Sigma Xi; Phi Lambda Upsilon; Cosmos Club, Washington D.C.. In addition he belongs to the American Chemical Society; the Association for Computing Machinery; the Society for Social Studies of Science.

Dr. Shull served as a member of the Naval Studies Board of the National Resear Council from 1974 to 1979 and as a member of the CNO's Executive Panel from 1984 to 1988. He is also a member of the Board of Trustees of the Institute for Defense Analyses.



THE NAVAL POSTGRADUATE SCHOOL

The Naval Postgraduate School opened in Annapolis in 1909 and transferred to the Monterey Peninsula in 1952. Since its beginning, the school has conferred over 22,000 degrees. The typical students is an unrestricted line U.S. Naval Officer who has completed an operational tour. Students are engaged in intensive studies leading to a master's degree in one of 37 different curricula split between 11 academic departments and 4 academic groups. Each curriculum is tailored to provide the academic requirements for an accredited advanced degree and meet the additional educational skill requirements necessary for subsequent assignments. Officers are obliged to remain in service for about four years after they complete their schooling.

Students arrive every quarter, with the heaviest influx entering in June and September. Of the approximately 1900 students now enrolled, about 75% are in the United States Navy and Marine Corps, 15% are from other United States services, and the remaining 10% are from allied countries.

Many of the 350 professors at the school are internationally recognized in their respective fields. In order to keep abreast in their areas of expertise, faculty members conduct research beneficial to many governmental agencies. Over 27 million dollars of research is conducted or administered annually at the school.

The Superintendent, RAD Thomas A. Mercer, with the assistance of Provost Harrison Shull, guides the school inn its endeavors. There is also a civilian Dean of Faculty, Dean of Instruction, Dean of Computer and Information, Dean of Research, and two U.S. Navy Captains who serve as the Dean of Students/Director of Programs and Director of Military Operations.

Guests are invited to tour the school grounds and to visit the Naval Postgraduate School Museum located in the basement of Herrmann Hall. The museum is designed to capture the rich history of both the school and the Old Del Monte Hotel through displays and artifacts.
