Dr. John Arquilla, noted defense strategist and professor at the Naval Postgraduate School in Monterey, will join David Rothkopf, CEO of Intellibridge Corporation and former Deputy Undersecretary of Commerce in the Clinton Administration, to discuss “The War on Terror One Year Later: In Search of Security” at the World Affairs Council of Northern California on Tuesday, Sept. 10 at 6 p.m.

Arquilla’s teaching includes courses in the history of special operations, international political theory, the revolution in military affairs, and information age-conflict. His most recent book is *Networks and Netwars: The Future of Terror, Crime, and Militancy*, (RAND, 2001), while his earlier 1997 book, *In Athena's Camp* (RAND) explored the many political, social, and military dimensions of the future of conflict. A strategist known for his visionary analyses, Arquilla’s ideas have also reached broad general audiences in publications including: *Time*, *The Economist*, *The New Republic*, *Wired*, *Le Monde*, and *Al-Hayat*; and in appearances on all the major television networks. His writings have been translated into many languages, including Chinese, French, German, Greek, Hebrew, Japanese, Korean and Spanish.
