FROM THE DIRECTOR OF NAVAL INTELLIGENCE

Today is a very important day for Naval Intelligence. The creation of the Admiral Bobby R. Inman Intelligence Chair recognizes the significance of the academic partnership between the Office of Naval Intelligence and the Naval Postgraduate School (NPS). In today's post-Cold War world, naval intelligence professionals find themselves working in very demanding, dynamic, and highly technical environments addressing a broad spectrum of issues. The Intelligence Program offered by NPS teaches our officers and civilian intelligence analysts to think and provides them with the unique and critical skills necessary to excel in the execution of their duties.

The intelligence curriculum at NPS began in October 1973 with the arrival of 23 students in the Naval Intelligence Master of Arts Program. Over the years, the Intelligence Program has expanded into three separate intelligence curricula; Science & Technology, Regional, and Operational Intelligence. Three hundred intelligence professionals have graduated from this prestigious school since that first class, and 44 intelligence professionals are currently enrolled in a variety of programs on campus.

It is indeed fitting that we gather today to recognize both this important academic partnership and Admiral Bobby R. Inman, an outstanding Navy leader. Admiral Inman is a superb role model for all intelligence specialists, a distinguished lecturer at NPS, and a champion of professional excellence. It is my intent that the incumbent of the Admiral Bobby R. Inman Intelligence Chair serve as an outstanding educator and mentor of the future leaders of the United States Navy.

DEDICATION AND HONOR

Admiral Inman was born in Rhonesboro, Texas, on 4 April 1931 and graduated from the University of Texas at Austin in 1950 with a bachelor's degree. He entered the Naval Reserve the following year and was commissioned as an Ensign in March 1952. Over the next 19 years, he served on an aircraft carrier, two cruisers, and a destroyer as well as in numerous assignments ashore in Naval Intelligence.

He graduated from the National War College in 1972, was selected for promotion to Rear Admiral in January 1974 and was promoted to Vice Admiral in 1976. Promoted to Admiral in 1981, he became the first Naval Intelligence Specialist to attain four star rank. He retired on 1 July 1982. Between 1974 and 1982, Admiral Inman served in tours as Director of Naval Intelligence, Vice Director of the Defense Intelligence Agency, Director of the National Security Agency, and Deputy Director of Central Intelligence.

Since his retirement, Admiral Inman has served as the Chairman, President or Chief Executive Officer of several major companies. He is also a member of the Board of Directors of Fluor, Science Applications International, Southwestern Bell, Temple Inland, and Xerox. Admiral Inman is an Adjunct Professor at the LBJ School of Public Affairs and the Graduate School of Business of the University of Texas at Austin. He serves as a Trustee for the California Institute of Technology, Southwestern University, and the Center for Excellence in Education, and is a member of the National Academy of Public Administration.

Over the course of his long and distinguished career, Admiral Inman has been a leading advocate of advanced professional education opportunities for intelligence professionals and, in particular, the creation of an intelligence curriculum at the Naval Postgraduate School (NPS). As a champion of academic excellence, he has demonstrated deep personal commitment to the NPS Intelligence Program by serving as a senior level mentor and role model, while periodically returning to Monterey as a distinguished lecturer.
