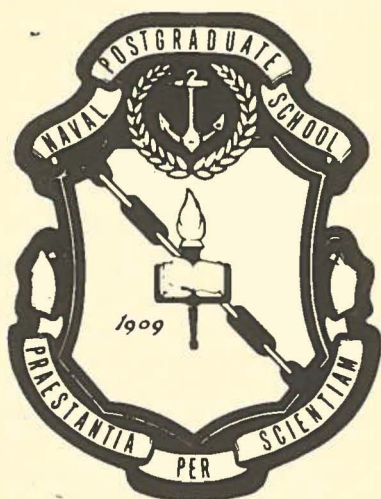

BIOGRAPHICAL INFORMATION

Morse Drive. In honor of the late Mr. Samuel F. B. Morse (1886-1969) South and East Roads are being renamed Morse Drive. Mr. Morse is being recognized today for his many accomplishments, in particular the design of the old Del Monte Hotel and the grounds which now serve as the Naval Postgraduate School campus. Mr. Morse actively pursued a lease arrangement of the Hotel complex to the Navy for use as a pilot training center during the war. Following the war, he was the principal architect of the plan to sell the hotel and grounds to the Navy.

Michael J. Smith Lane. In recognition of the late Captain Michael J. Smith's (1945-1986) achievements and sacrifice, Higuera Road is being renamed Michael J. Smith Lane. A former Naval Postgraduate School alumnus and Challenger Astronaut, Captain Smith is an excellent example for future Naval Postgraduate School students to emulate. Captain Smith graduated from the Naval Postgraduate School in 1968 with a Masters degree in Aeronautical Engineering.

Cunningham Road. In honor of the late Professor Emeritus Peyton W. Cunningham (1906-1980) Fifth Avenue is being renamed Cunningham Road. Professor Cunningham was a prominent Naval Postgraduate School Professor from 1945-1976. He was instrumental in establishing the Department of Operations Research and was active in the Physics Department. Professor Cunningham established and chaired the Antisubmarine Warfare Academic Group.

Stone Road. In recognition of Rear Admiral Earl E. Stone's (1895 -) distinguished service to his country beginning in 1917 as a graduate of the Naval Academy and ending as Superintendent of the Naval Postgraduate School, Middle Road is being renamed Stone Road. Rear Admiral Stone served aboard destroyers, became an expert in communications, then commanded the Battleship WISCONSIN during WWII. At Pear Harbor he was the executive officer of the USS CALIFORNIA. As Director of Naval Communications following WWII Commodore Stone established the Armed Forces Security Agency. Following duty as COMCRUDIV ONE in Korea he served as Superintendent of the Naval Postgraduate School. Currently Rear Admiral Stone resides in Monterey.

Menneken Circle. As a tribute to the late Professor Carl E. Menneken (1905-1975) Engineers Circle is being renamed Menneken Circle. Professor Menneken's distinguished thirty-three year career with the Naval Postgraduate School began in 1942 as an officer in the Naval Reserve. Professor Menneken joined the civilian faculty in the Department of Electrical Engineering in 1946. Professor Menneken significantly contributed to Naval Research, particularly in mine warfare, antennas and precise navigation. In 1951 he served as Electronics Branch head at the Office of Naval Research and in 1962 served as Deputy Director of the London Branch Office of Naval Research.
