The Center for Homeland Defense and Security is pleased to announce that the Naval Postgraduate School [Homeland Security Digital Library](#) (HSDL) has made almost 23,000 resources, transferred from the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA)'s [Lessons Learned Information Sharing](#) (LLIS) program, searchable on the HSDL website. In partnership with FEMA LLIS, we believe this consolidation will improve the whole community's access to valuable information.

“Over the years the HSDL and LLIS have served similar communities: state, local and federal emergency managers and homeland security professionals,” says Jodi Stiles, Chief Information Officer at the Center for Homeland Defense and Security (CHDS). “We can now better support those communities by simplifying access to the resources they need, so that they can find a broader array of materials in a more direct way.”

The content transferred to HSDL will maintain a similar level of accessibility as LLIS.gov. Documents that required a username and password to view on LLIS.gov will also require a username and password on HSDL.org. While LLIS.gov log-in credentials do not transfer, you can easily create a new HSDL account by visiting the HSDL login page. Please note that some content is available without a password. To search for publicly available documents visit HSDL.org and use the search bar function on the homepage.

“With the inclusion of the LLIS content, the HSDL now has a much more robust collection,” says Greta E. Marlatt, HSDL Content Manager. “This consolidation allows our academic communities and partners greater access to exciting new content and expands the reach of LLIS.”
