I graduated from the University of Kansas in 1992 with a Bachelor of Science degree in Geology. While attending Kansas, I was employed by the Internal Revenue Service as a Tax Examiner. Upon graduation I began working at Mare Island Naval Shipyard, a submarine overhaul, refueling, and repair facility in January of 1983 as a Physical Science Technician performing various radiological control functions associated with nuclear reactor repair/maintenance. Four years later I was promoted to Radiological Controls Supervisor of the Mare Island Steam Generator Inspection Team. This position involved developing and implementing health and safety requirements for a specialized group of mechanics that inspected and repaired the internal components of the primary side of nuclear steam generators. As a member of the team, I was able to supervise the actual field work at remote sites in various ports throughout the world. In 1991 I transferred to the Occupational Safety, Health, and Environmental office as a Supervisory Industrial Hygienist. My primary responsibility was to supervise a workforce of OSH Specialists that performed monitoring duties for various health stressors encountered at the shipyard. For the past few months I was also employed as the Asbestos Program Manager. Due to the scheduled base closure of Mare Island Naval Shipyard in April of 1996, I have transferred to the Naval Postgraduate School as the Safety and Occupational Health Manager with duties commencing 7 Feb 1994.
