RESUME OF JOSEPH HENRY CYR

Joseph H. Cyr, United States Navy, was born in Plainfield, Connecticut, on 3 September 1932. He enlisted in the United States Navy in 1950 and was commissioned as Ensign in 1958 through the Integration Program.

While enlisted, he served as radarman aboard USS PARLE (DE-708), USS GOODRICH (DDR-831), and USS YELLOWSTONE (AD-27). In 1955, as Petty Officer First Class, he attended Electronics Technician School, Great Lakes and converted his rate to Electronics Technician.

While at Great Lakes, he was selected as part of the first group to enter the Navy Enlisted Advanced School Program (now called the Navy Enlisted Scientific Education Program) and entered Purdue University in 1956, where he was certified as Associate Technical Aide in Electrical Technology in 1958, and received the Bachelor of Science degree in Electrical Engineering in 1960.

He then reported to the commissioning detail for the USS JOHN KING (DDG-3) as prospective communications officer. In 1963, he was assigned as instructor in Naval Tactical Data Systems at the Fleet Anti-Air Warfare Training Center at Dam Neck, Virginia.

He reported to the USS KING (DLG-10) in 1965 for duty as operations officer, and in 1967 he was ordered to the Naval Postgraduate School, Monterey, California, and received the degree of Master of Science in Operations Research in September 1969.

Following graduation, he reported to the Staff of Commander, U. S. Naval Forces, Vietnam, and served as an operations analyst in Saigon. In 1971 he was assigned to the USS NOA (DD-841) as Executive Officer.

In August 1972 he reported to the Naval Postgraduate School, Monterey, California as Assistant Curricular Officer for the Operations Research/Systems Analysis Programs. In February 1974 he became Acting Curricular Officer.
