RESUME OF ROBERT JONES CASTLEMAN, JR.

Robert J. Castleman, Jr., was born in Jackson, Tennessee on 27 December 1937. He received his secondary education in that city and attended the University of Tennessee for one year prior to entering the United States Military Academy. He graduated from West Point in 1960 with a Bachelor of Science degree in Military Science and was commissioned a Second Lieutenant in the field artillery. In June 1970 he received a Master of Science in Operations Research from the Naval Postgraduate School, Monterey, California.



Shortly after graduation from West Point he completed both the Airborne and Ranger Qualification courses. His initial unit assignment was with the 101st Airborne Division where he served in various battery level field artillery positions in both cannon and field artillery rocket units. Other field artillery assignments include cannon battery commands in the Republic of Korea, at Fort Carson, Colorado, and in the Republic of Vietnam with the 25th Infantry Division Artillery. He recently completed two years of duty with an eight inch howitzer battalion, initially serving as S3 and subsequently as Battalion Executive Officer.

His formal military education includes completion of both the Field Artillery Officer Basic Course and the Field Artillery Officer Advanced Course. He is a 1974 graduate of the Command and General Staff College at Fort Leavenworth, Kansas. He is also a graduate of the Industrial College of the Armed Forces, having completed the course of instruction by correspondence. From 1970 through 1973 he was assigned to the Department of Mathematics at the United States Military Academy where he served two years as an Instructor in various courses of mathematics, and one year as Assistant Professor and Chairman of the Probability and Statistics Committee.

In October 1976 he joined the faculty of the Naval Postgraduate School where he is teaching in the Department of Operations Research.

In his most recent assignment he served as Program Manager and Military Operations Research Analyst in the Training Simulation Team, Director of Training Development, Fort Sill, Oklahoma. He is recipient of the Bronze Star Medal and several awards of the Army Commendation Medal. He was recently selected for promotion to Lieutenant Colonel.
