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RESUME OF ALDEN BUFFINGTON CHACE, JR.

Alden B. Chace, Jr., United States Navy, was born 13 December 1939 in San Francisco, California. He graduated from the U. S. Naval Academy with a Bachelor of Science in 1962.

Following Submarine School at New London, Connecticut, he served on the diesel submarines SABALO, TUNNY, and PERCH while variously home ported in Pearl Harbor or Subic Bay, Philippine Islands.

In September 1969 he completed a Master's degree in Oceanography at the Naval Postgraduate School, Monterey, California. His thesis concerned ocean wave forecasting.

He then returned to sea duty on the submarine HARDHEAD as an engineer officer.

As a civilian he attended graduate school at the University of Rhode Island. During 1974 he worked under a National Science Foundation grant designing and building gamma-ray density instrumentation for marine sediment. He received a Ph. D. in ocean engineering from the University of Rhode Island in 1975.

Upon returning to active duty he was designated for Special Duty (Geophysics). Following five months at the Fleet Numerical Weather Central he joined the faculty of the Naval Postgraduate School, Monterey, California, in June 1976 where he is teaching in the Department of Oceanography.

He is a registered professional engineer, and associate member of the American Society of Civil Engineers, and a member of the National Society of Professional Engineers, California Society of Professional Engineers, Marine Technology Society, and International Oceanographic Foundation.
