RESUME OF DANIEL R. DOLK

Daniel R. Dolk was born June 1, 1944 in Chicago, Illinois.

He attended Rensselaer Polytechnic Institute in Troy, N.Y. where he received B.S. and M.S. degrees in mathematics in 1966 and 1967 respectively. He attended the University of Arizona in Tucson, AZ from 1975 to 1982 where he received an M.S. degree in management information systems in 1977. He is currently finishing his Ph.D. degree in MIS in the field of artificial intelligence and model management systems.

Mr. Dolk worked from 1967 to 1972 as a scientific programmer involved with nuclear reactor design for the Knolls Atomic Power laboratory in Schenectady, NY. After two years of consulting and traveling, he worked from 1974 to 1982 as a research specialist at the Division of Economic and Business Research, University of Arizona, designing information systems for economic data and analysis.

In August 1982, Mr. Dolk joined the faculty of the Naval Postgraduate School where he is an assistant professor of management information systems in the Department of Administrative Sciences.
