RESUME OF DAVID V. LAMM

David V. Lamm was born in Pipestone, Minnesota, on 8 November 1941. He attended the University of Minnesota where he majored in History with a minor in Political Science and received the degree of Bachelor of Arts in December 1964. He attended the George Washington University receiving a Master of Business Administration in February 1972. His thesis concerned the interface between Department of Defense contract administration and contract audit. He received the Doctor of Business Administration (DBA) degree from The George Washington University (GWU) in 1976. His dissertation involved the administration of cost accounting standards to defense contracts. He enlisted in the Navy on 7 December 1958 and, following graduation from Officer Candidate School (OCS), was commissioned in the Supply Corps on 11 June 1965. He retired on 1 November 1985.



In August 1976, he joined the GWU faculty as a professorial lecturer in the graduate procurement contract management program. He transferred to the Naval Postgraduate School, Monterey, California, as a military assistant professor teaching in the Acquisition and Contract Management curriculum from July 1978 to June 1981 and again from July 1983 until retirement in November 1985. He joined the NPS faculty as a civilian professor in November 1985. His research has been concerned with acquisition and contract management principles and policies, particularly acquisition strategy, contract negotiations and contract modeling. He is an associate professor in the Administrative Sciences Department.

He has served as the Academic Associate for the Acquisition and Contract Management Curriculum from July 1979-June 1981 and June 1985 to the present.

He is a member of the National Contract Management Association (NCMA) and the American Society of Military Comptrollers. He is the National Certification Director for NCMA.

He received the 1988 Rear Admiral John Jay Schieffelin Award for Excellence in Teaching from the Naval Postgraduate School.
