RESUME OF KENNETH ROBERT LUCAS

Kenneth Lucas was born in Kansas City, Missouri, in 1925. He attended Washburn University in Topeka, Kansas, after serving three years in World War II. He received the degree of Bachelor of Science in August, 1949.

Graduate study followed at the University of Kansas until 1951, when he was employed by Hercules Powder Company as Quality Control Supervisor.

He returned to Kansas University in 1953, sponsored by a National Science Foundation Scholarship, and received the degree of Doctor of Philosophy in June, 1957. His research, in the field of Lipschitzian Manifolds, was under the direction of Professor Nachman Aronszajn. His thesis was issued as a technical report of ONR Project 58304.

The years following his graduation he was employed by New Mexico State University.

He joined the faculty of the Department of Mathematics at the U. S. Naval Postgraduate School, Monterey, California, in July, 1958. His research interest is in certain natural topologies in linear spaces.

He is a member of the American Mathematical Society and Sigma Xi.
