RESUME OF MAGDI NESSIM KAMEL

Magdi N. Kamel was born in Port Said, Egypt, on July 30th, 1953. He received his B.S. degree in Aeronautical Engineering from Cairo University in 1975 and a M.A. degree in Systems Management from American University in Cairo in 1979. He attended the Wharton School of the University of Pennsylvania from 1983 where he received his M.S. and Ph.D. degrees in Management Information Systems in 1986 and 1988, respectively. His dissertation dealt with the efficient implementation of semantic integrity constraints and views in database management systems.



Dr. Kamel worked from 1979 to 1983 as a consultant analyst at the Middle East/Africa Regional Support Center of NCR Corporation. His responsibilities included the analysis, design, and implementation of business computer applications as well as training. Dr. Kamel joined the faculty of the Naval Postgraduate School in August 1988 where he is currently an assistant professor of Management Information Systems.

Dr. Kamel main teaching interests are in the areas of database management systems, decision support and expert systems, and distributed systems. His main research interests include semantic modeling, data models and languages, semantic integrity, view processing strategies, and heterogeneous databases.

Dr. Kamel is a member of the Association for Computing Machinery (ACM) and the IEEE Computer Society.
