RESUME OF SAMUEL DELL MCLEOD, JR.

Samuel D. McLeod, Jr., United States Navy, was born in Bronwood, Georgia, on 18 August 1936. He enlisted in the United States Navy in 1954 and was commissioned an Ensign in 1961.

His enlisted service included duty aboard USS PICKEREL (SS-524), USS BASHAW (SSK-241) and USS RASHER (SSR-269) as a Fire Control Technician and aboard USS ROBERT E. LEE (SSBN-601) (GOLD) as a Guided Missileman.

After attending Officer Candidate School in Newport, Rhode Island, he was assigned to USS BARBERO (SSG-317) in 1961. He was ordered to U. S. Naval Guided Missile School at Dam Neck, Virginia, in 1963 prior to assignment aboard USS DANIEL WEBSTER (SSBN-626) (GOLD) as Assistant Weapons Officer and later as Weapons Officer.

He returned to U. S. Naval Guided Missile School in 1966 as an instructor and coordinator for the prospective commanding officer course for the Polaris Weapons System.

In 1968 he reported to USS RUNNER (SS-476). Upon decommissioning of USS RUNNER in 1969, he was reassigned to USS GRAMPUS (SS-523). His duty aboard USS GRAMPUS was followed by a short tour at Commander Fleet Air Wings, Atlantic in Norfolk, Virginia, in 1970 as Submarine Coordinator.

He attended the Naval Postgraduate School during 1971 and 1972, graduating from the Baccalaureate Program in September 1972 when he received the degree of Bachelor of Science with major in Computer Science.

After graduation he reported for duty as Assistant Curricular Officer for Engineering Science Programs. He received the degree Master of Science in Computer Systems Management in June 1975.

In September 1975 he became Program Manager for Continuing Education Counseling and Curricular Officer for Engineering Science.
