RESUME OF DOUGLAS ELMER NEIL

Douglas E. Neil was born in Modesto, California, on 2 September 1938. He attended the University of Southern California where he majored in psychology and was awarded a Bachelor of Arts in February 1965.

Graduate study in experimental psychology followed at University of Pacific in Stockton, California, where he received the Master of Arts degree in June 1967.

Upon completion of the M.A., he was employed as the Metropolitan District Personnel and Safety Director of the Foremost-McKessen Corporation.

In September 1968, he entered North Carolina State University and was awarded the Doctor of Philosophy degree in July 1971. While at North Carolina State he was involved in research into sonar system display design parameters. His dissertation research was in the area of biomechanics and neuro-muscular behavior. In July 1969, he was awarded a Public Health Service Fellowship in Systems Safety Engineering.

He was then employed by the University of North Carolina Highway Safety Research Center. While at the Center he conducted research on the relationship of peripheral vision and subjective feelings of fatigue to driving performance.

In July 1972, he joined the faculty of the Naval Postgraduate School, Monterey, California, where he is teaching in the Department of Operations Research.

He is a member of the Human Factors Society, Ergonomics Research Society, Aerospace Medical Society, Society of Automotive Engineers, and the Medical Electronics and Data Society.
