RESUME OF JAMES CLAY ROBERTSON

James C. Robertson, SC, United States Navy, was born on 22 November 1945 in Schenectady, New York. He attended Colgate University in Hamilton, New York, where he majored in economics. He received the degree of Bachelor of Arts in June 1967.

In August 1972 he entered the University of Virginia's Colgate Darden School of Business Administration. He received the Master of Business Administration degree in June 1974. He was awarded the school's 1973 William Michael Sherman Award and was named a President Shannon Scholar in 1974. He was elected to the Lychnos Honorary Society.



He was commissioned an Ensign in the United States Navy in 1967 after four months training at the Naval Officer Candidate School.

After instruction tours at the Navy Supply Corps School and the Navy Submarine School, he served for two years as the Supply Officer, USS FRANCIS SCOTT KEY (SSBN 657), a polaris submarine. Subsequent tours have been on the staff, Commander Submarine Force, U. S. Atlantic Fleet, as the Assistant Comptroller for Financial Management, and as the Stock Control Officer, USS HOLLAND (AS 32), the submarine tender home-ported at Holy Loch, Scotland.

Civilian employment has been with the Goodyear Aerospace Corporation in the Financial Data Processing Department, and with Price Waterhouse and Company, as a staff auditor.

In August 1976 he reported to the Naval Postgraduate School, Monterey, California, where he is teaching in the Department of Administrative Sciences.
