## RESUME OF LYLE VERNON RICH

Lyle V. Rich, United States Navy, was born in Normal, Illinois, on 13 January 1947. He attended Illinois State University where he received a Bachelor of Science degree in Mathematics in June 1969. After commissioning as an Ensign in the United States Navy, he was assigned to the Naval Postgraduate School as an IGEP student. He received the degree of Master of Science in Computer Science, with distinction in December 1971.

He was employed by Bloomington High School, Bloomington, Illinois, as a German teacher. While attending graduate school at Illinois State University, he was employed as a graduate assistant in mathematics, where he was responsible for the lab instruction of a college algebra course.

After graduation from the Naval Postgraduate School, he was assigned to CNATRA, Pensacola, Florida, as a flight student, and was subsequently medically disqualified. While waiting orders to the Supply Corps School in Athens, Georgia, he was assigned as a system analyst at the NAS data processing center. Subsequent to graduation from Supply Corps School, he was assigned to the Precom Detail for USS DAHLGREN (DLG-12). He was assigned to USS DAHLGREN as Disbursing Officer and assistant project manager for the DLG/ADP COMMAND MANAGEMENT SYSTEM, which was studying the feasibility of integrating small scale computers into the management of DLG-class ships.

In March 1975 he joined the faculty of the Naval Postgraduate School, Monterey, California, where he is teaching in the Computer Science Group.
