RESUME OF PATRICK JOHNSTON PARKER

Patrick J. Parker was born in London, England, on 4 April 1931. He received a B. A. and an M. A. with highest honors from the University of Chicago in 1955.

From 1955-56 he was an Instructor at Knox College in Illinois. From 1956-57 he was a graduate student at the University of Chicago and Director, Economic Analysis Programs, Industrial Relations Center. From 1957-61 he was an Assistant Professor at the University of California at Berkeley and Research Associate in the Department of Forestry. From 1961-62 he was an Associate Professor of Economics and Statistics at the Naval Postgraduate School.



From 1963-65 he was a Senior Staff Member, Director, Tactical Air Programs, Center for Naval Analyses. From 1965-66 he was Director, Tactical Air Programs, OASD(SA).

From 1966-70 he was President, Parker and Meckling Assoc. Inc., consultants to Xerox, Northrop, Fairchild and Kaman Corps. During this period he was also Associate Dean of the Graduate School of Management at the University of Rochester. From 1968-70 he was Special Assistant to the President of the University of Rochester for the Center for Naval Analyses and Member of Board of Overseers and Chairman of the Executive Committee of C. N. A.

From 1970-71 he was President and Director of P. J. Parker Inc., and Hickok Manufacturing Company and Subsidiaries. From 1972-74 he was Deputy Assistant Secretary of Defense (Intelligence Assessment).

In September 1974 he joined the faculty of the Naval Postgraduate School, Monterey, California, where he is a Chair Research Professor of Systems Analysis. On 1 October 1976 he was appointed Chairman of the Department of National Security Affairs.

His honors include Beta Gamma Sigma, Weyerhaeuser Fellow, and Outstanding Young Men of America. He was a member of the Board of Trustees, Shimer College from 1968-73, and from 1971-72 he was Chairman of the Chief of Naval Operations Executive Panel on which he continues to serve.
