RESUME OF RICHARD BRAY RENNER

Commander Richard B. Renner was born in Cincinnati, Ohio, on 21 February 1934. He received a Bachelor of Science and a commission in the U.S. Navy from the U.S. Naval Academy in June 1957. Subsequently he was awarded a Master of Science in Operations Research from the Naval Postgraduate School in September 1975.

After 18 months as Communications Officer aboard the USS Ross (DD563), he entered flight training and was designated a Naval Aviator in September 1960. After tours with VS-21 and VS-41 in San Diego, he entered the Navy Supply Corps School in Athens, Georgia, in August 1964. Graduating as the honor student of his class, he was assigned as Supply Officer, USS Fort Snelling (LSD 30) in March 1965.

He served for three years at MCAS Cherry Point, North Carolina as Material Officer and Inventory Control Officer, departing in September 1969 for the Naval Support Activity, Da Nang. Upon his return in August 1970, he served as the Planning Officer, NAS Norfolk. CDR Renner entered the Naval Postgraduate School in summer of 1973. Upon graduation, he reported to the Aviation Supply Office as a Systems Design Branch Head.

CDR Renner was reassigned in April 1977 as the Logistics Advisor to the Imperial Iranian Air Force for the F-14 and P-3 programs. He returned from Tehran, Iran in February 1979 and was assigned as a Systems Analyst in the Defense Logistics Analysis Office.

CDR Renner reported as the Administrative Sciences Curricular Officer in October 1980.
