## RESUME OF JONATHAN CILLEY TIBBITTS

Jonathan C. Tibbitts, Civil Engineer Corps, U. S. Navy, was born in Oakland, California, on 11 August 1935. He attended Whitman College, Walla Walla, Washington, and the California Institute of Technology, Pasadena, California, receiving a Bachelor of Arts degree in Mathematics/Physics from Whitman and a Bachelor of Science degree in Civil Engineering from Cal Tech. He was commissioned an Ensign, Civil Engineer Corps, in December 1958 following four months at the Naval Officer Candidate School in Newport, Rhode Island. In June 1971 he received a Master of Science degree in Civil Engineering (Engineering & Economic Planning) from Stanford University.



He has served with Naval Mobile Construction Battalion Ten, during which time he was Officer in Charge of a Seabee Detachment on Canton Island which successfully constructed a satellite tracking facility for NASA's Project Mercury. He has also served in contract administration positions with the District Public Works Office, Twelfth Naval District, San Bruno, and the South-West Division, Naval Facilities Engineering Command, San Diego. He has been Assistant Public Works Officer at the Naval Air Station, Key West, Florida, and Public Works Officer at the Naval Air Facility, Naples, Italy. He served as Base Development Officer for the III Marine Amphibious Force in Danang, Republic of Vietnam from mid 1967 to mid 1968. Other tours of duty have included the position of Deputy Director for Management Information Systems, Facilities Systems Office, Port Hueneme, California, and a two-year assignment at the Navy Public Works Center, San Diego, California. Prior to reporting to the Naval Postgraduate School, he served as Deputy to the Officer in Charge of Construction, Marianas, on Guam.

In June 1975 he reported to the Naval Postgraduate School, Monterey, California, where he is teaching in the Department of Administrative Sciences.

He wears the Bronze Star with Combat V, awarded for his efforts with III Marine Amphibious Force in Vietnam. He is a registered Civil Engineer in the states of California and Louisiana.
