RESUME OF MICHAEL GRAHAM SOVEREIGN

Michael G. Sovereign was born in Berwyn, Illinois, in 1937. He received a bachelor's degree in chemical engineering from the University of Illinois in 1959, and a master's degree in industrial management from Purdue University in 1960. In 1965 he received the Ph.D. from Purdue University with a major in economics. During his graduate work he served as assistant treasurer for the Midwest Program on Airborne Television Instruction, Incorporated.

Following graduation he became Assistant Professor of Business Administration at the University of Illinois where he taught production and logistics management, as well as quantitative techniques for business. He is the co-author of Quantitative Models for Production Management, Prentice Hall.



In 1969 he served as operations research analyst with the Office of the Secretary of Defense, Systems Analysis in the Mobility Forces area.

In August 1970, he joined the faculty of the Naval Postgraduate School, Monterey, California. From June 1976 to August 1980 he served as Chairman of the Department of Operations Research. He was promoted to Professor in April 1978. From September 1980 to 1981 he served as Director, Special Projects Groups, Office of Secretary of Defense (Comptroller). He is currently chairman of the Command, Control and Communications Academic Group.

He is a member of the American Economic Association, the Institute of Management Sciences and Operations Research Society of America. He is a former member of the Board of Directors and past treasurer of the Military Operations Research Society. He was a founding Director of the Institute of Cost Analysis.

In 1982 he was awarded the Secretary of Defense's Meritorious Civilian Service Medal.
