## RESUME OF NATALIE J. WEBB

Natalie J. Webb was born in Lansing, Michigan. She graduated from North Carolina State University and received the degree Bachelor of Science in Computer Science in 1982.

Dr. Webb attended Meredith College, where she earned the degree Master of Business Administration in 1986. Additional graduate study at Duke University resulted in the degree Doctor of Philosophy in Economics in 1992. Her dissertation concerned the economics of corporate contributions to charitable organizations.

Dr. Webb has served as an instructor at Duke University in 1990-92 and a Teaching and Research Assistant at Duke from 1986-1992. She has served as a computer consultant for Webb Technical Group, Inc., in Raleigh, North Carolina; a software systems engineer, Northern Telecom Inc., Research Triangle Park, North Carolina, and a cooperative education student (full-time employee alternating semesters) at Northern Telecom, Inc.



Dr. Webb joined the faculty of the Naval Postgraduate School in 1992 as an Assistant Professor at the Defense Resources Management Institute.

Her current research is concerned with corporate charitable activities, social discounting, U. S. Army advertising, and other topics in applied economics and public finance.

She is a member of The Academy of Management, the American Economic Association, the Association for Research on Nonprofit Organizations and Voluntary Action (ARNOVA), the Committee on the Status of Women in the Economics Profession, the Southern Economic Association, and the Western Economic Association, International.
