## RESUME OF ROBERT LEE WARTERS

Robert L. Warters, United States Navy, was born in Knoxville, Tennessee, on 29 December 1933. He attended the University of Tennessee for two years, and then was appointed as a midshipman at the U. S. Naval Academy. He graduated from the Naval Academy in 1957 receiving a Bachelor of Science degree.

He next reported to USS CAPRICORNIOUS (AKA 57) where he served for two years in various engineering billets.

In 1959 he attended the U. S. Navy Submarine School at New London, Connecticut, and upon graduation he reported to USS CHIVO (SS 341) where he served until 1961.

In 1961 he began three years of graduate study at Massachusetts Institute of Technology. In 1964 he was awarded a Master of Science degree in Naval Architecture and Marine Engineering, and a Naval Engineer degree.

After graduation he was assigned to Bureau of Ships in the Ship Design section. In 1969 he reported to Chief of Naval Operations (OP 96) and was assigned to the Center for Naval Analyses.

In 1970 he was assigned to Mare Island Naval Shipyard where he served in various positions until 1975.

In August 1975 he reported to the Naval Postgraduate School, Monterey, California, where he is the Curricular Officer for Naval Engineering Programs.
