RESUME OF STEWART W. SCHRECKENGAST

LCDR Stewart W. Schreckengast was born in Ames, Iowa on April 26, 1950. He attended the University of Notre Dame under the Naval Reserve Officer Training program and received his Bachelors of Science degree in Architectural Engineering in 1973. LCDR Schreckengast entered the Navy as a Student Naval Aviator and received his wings on June 14, 1974.

Following flight training, LCDR Schreckengast reported to HM-12 in Norfolk, Virginia for duty involving Airborne Mine Countermeasures (AMCM). During this tour he became Aircraft Commander in the RH-53D helicopter and made deployments throughout North America and the Western Pacific.

In 1978 LCDR Schreckengast attended the Naval Postgraduate School and graduated in 1980 with a Masters of Science degree in Aeronautical Engineering.

After Monterey, LCDR Schreckengast was assigned to HM-16, returning to the AMCM mission. During this tour he deployed to the Persian Gulf as Mine Warfare Officer. Following this deployment he transferred to the Naval Air Development Center conducting flight test evaluations in the CH-53A and P-3 aircraft. In January 1985, LCDR Schreckengast received orders to VC-5 in the Republic of the Philippines. During this tour he conducted fleet support missions throughout the Western Pacific flying A-4, SH-3G and CH-53E aircraft.

LCDR Schreckengast has 2,800 flight hours and is an FAA certified fixed wing and helicopter flight instructor. He is married to the former Jacqueline McMullen of Vallejo, California. They have one son, Jonathan. LCDR Schreckengast was assigned to the Aviation Safety Programs in July, 1988.
