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RESUME OF WAYNE MITCHELL WRIGHT

Wayne Wright was born on July 12, 1934 in Sanford, Maine. He attended Bowdoin College in Brunswick, Maine, where he received the Bachelor of Arts degree in physics in 1956. He then enrolled as a graduate student in the Division of Engineering and Applied Physics of Harvard University, receiving the Master of Science degree in 1957 and the Doctor of Philosophy degree in Applied Physics, with specialization in Acoustics, in 1961.

During the 1961-62 academic year he held a post-doctoral appointment at Harvard University and was Deputy Director of its Acoustics Research Laboratory.

Since September, 1962 he has served as Assistant Professor and Associate Professor of Physics at Kalamazoo College, Kalamazoo, Michigan. He was Acting Chairman of the Physics Department during 1968-69. Since 1962 he has been the principal investigator on a research contract with the Acoustics Branch of the Office of Naval Research, and he also has served as the director of several projects supported by the National Science Foundation, Undergraduate Research Participation Program. During the summer of 1964 he was a consultant with the Marine Physical Laboratory, Scripps Institution of Oceanography, and for the summer of 1967 he was a Visiting Assistant Professor of Electrical Engineering at the University of Rochester, New York.

Mr. Wright is spending the 1969-70 year as a Visiting Associate Professor of Physics at the Naval Postgraduate School, while on sabbatical leave from Kalamazoo College.

He is a member of the Acoustical Society of America, the American Association of Physics Teachers, Sigma Xi, and Phi Beta Kappa.
