

RESUME OF GEORGE THOMAS

George Thomas was born in Milwaukee, Wisconsin on September 8, 1943. He majored in economics at Southern Illinois University in Carbondale, receiving a Bachelor of Science degree in 1967. He attended graduate school in the Krannert School of Management at Purdue University, receiving the Doctor of Philosophy degree in economics in 1971. His research concerned the extension of microeconomic decision rules into an environment characterized by probabilistic outcomes.

He taught economics and quantitative methods as a member of the faculty of the University of Hawaii from 1971 to 1973. During the summer of 1973 he served as an Adjunct Professor of Economics at the Naval Postgraduate School. In the fall



of 1973 he joined the faculty of the University of Redlands in Redlands, California as an Associate Professor. In 1975 he was promoted to Professor of Economics and Management Science.

In the fall of 1974 he was appointed Chairman of the Department of Economics and Business Administration at the University of Redlands, serving in that capacity until the spring of 1976. His teaching was mainly in the areas of applied microeconomics, particularly managerial economics and management science. He has served as an economic consultant to a number of local and state governmental agencies.

In the summer of 1978 he joined the faculty of the Naval Postgraduate School, Monterey, California as an Adjunct Professor of Economics. He has continued his research in probabilistic economics, manpower economics, and health economics.

He is a member of the American Economic Association, the American Institute of Decision Science, the Institute of Management Science, and the Western Economic Association.
