

Balut has, in the past year, presented research papers at two national conferences of the Operations Research Society of America and is planning to deliver another at the Society's November meeting in Atlantic City.

Also upcoming is the publication of a portion of his doctoral disseration in the periodical "Management Science Journal."

Lt. Cmdr. Balut's wife, Barbara, mother of three active daughters, Michelle, 6; Alison, 5: and Elizabeth, 1½; is known to many "Classmate" readers through her position as advertising director. Her flair in this area carries over to the civilian community where, during the past three years, she has capably handled the advertising duties for the Carmel Bach Festival; the National Horse Show, an annual event at the Monterey County Fairgrounds; and the Eastwood Tennis Tournament.

Active in military circles as well, Barbara has served as the O.S.W.C. Ways and Means Chairman, Vice President and President.
