

# Defense Contract Obligations v. Total Obligational Authority (TOA) 2000-2020








#### Research Questions



### Defense OTA Obligations, 2015-2020






### Defense Contract Obligations by Area, 2000-2020








### Defense R&D Obligations by Stage of R&D, 2015-2020






#### Defense Contract Obligations by Platform Portfolio, 2000-2020








#### Defense Contract Obligations by Component, 2000-2020
