




- Established in 2004 with a directed appropriation from Senator Reid.

Since 9-11, there have been 62 attacks on tourism destinations world-wide

- Kabul, Afghanistan
- Islamabad, Pakistan
- Mumbai, India
- Peshawar, Pakistan
- Jakarta, Indonesia









The Evolving Threat Environment

- Commercial facilities are vulnerable to terrorist attack:
 - They are open to the public and accommodate a large number of people,
 - Design and operation make it difficult to detect operational planning and surveillance.
- Tourism/resort facilities rely upon open access, are symbols of luxury, appeal to international clientele and often represent wealth and abundance.
- Tourism dependent economies possess multiple resort properties and are the sole economic engine for the city or the region (i.e., Las Vegas, Orlando, San Diego, Hawaii):
 - A successful attack in these cities would have a devastating effect on the region's economy.
 - RAND study (Oct 2007) ranks Las Vegas as 9th most likely city to suffer terrorist attack.









Challenges Remain

- U.S. Department of Labor reports 1 of every 7 people employed in the civilian labor force is directly or indirectly employed in the travel and tourism industry.
- U.S. Bureau of Economic Analysis reports tourism related goods and services generated an estimated \$1.23 trillion in CY 2006 supporting more than 8.5 million jobs.
- Despite improvements in research and resources available to emergency responders, there remains a shortfall of comprehensive and timely evidence-based research, case studies, cost-effective training, and technical assistance resources effectively organized for private sector security managers who protect "soft targets."

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



Why ISS?

Terrorism DVD

- Requested by: Nevada Commission on Homeland Security, LVMPD, Southern Nevada Counter-Terrorism Center
- Content: "Seven Signs of Terrorism"
 - Surveillance
 - Information gathering
 - Testing security (or probing)
 - Planning (acquiring supplies and funding)
 - Suspicious behavior
 - Rehearsal
 - Getting into position









Why ISS? (cont'd.)

Partnership Enhancement Research and Fusion (PERFusion)

- A three-part project to implement a training program to facilitate the exchange of information among the public safety community and their private sector security partners within Nevada.
- PERFusion will help fill a state and local priority requirement in information sharing; the program has increased importance in light of the attacks on "soft targets" (e.g. Mumbai, Islamabad).
- Intelligence-led policing and critical information sharing are crucial components in helping prevent such attacks from occurring in Nevada.








PERFusion Part 1 (June 2009 – March 2010)

Initial Web-based Services

- Capability to electronically collect Suspicious Activity Reports (SARs)
- Streaming video of "Nevada's 7 Signs of Terrorism" DVD
- Password-protected secure back-end supporting Library and Bulletin Board services
- E-mail Broadcast capability supporting multiple mail groups

Why ISS? PERFusion Part 2

(August 2009 – May 2010)

- Implement state-wide web-based training:
 - Develop & post 6-hour Terrorism Liaison Officer course
 - Develop & post 6-hour Fusion Liaison Officer course



- Use ISS Grant funds to help produce 5 short DVDs, focused on Nevada's "frontline" populations:
 - Guest Relation Attendant (housekeeping)
 - Valet Parking Attendant
 - Bellman
 - Transportation (rental car, taxi, limousine)
 - Facilities Engineer







Why ISS? PERFusion Part 3

(Unfunded)

- Produce seven additional specialty awareness DVDs (front desk personnel, porter, food & beverage staff, retail employees, hardware store staff, water plant staff, energy plant staff).
- Develop advanced FLO training (e.g. understanding Islamic culture, terrorist organizations, and rural & tribal area considerations).
- Enhance and maintain a resource library that provides research, and operational and technical support to law enforcement analysts and private sector security professionals.
- Conduct original research on technology options, response capabilities, and best practices based upon case studies of terrorist events and counter-measures.




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Tourism Security

Prospective Activities

- Research: Comprehensive research activities in furtherance of CFS prevention and protection technology countermeasures, case study lessons learned and operational concepts.
- Outreach: Production and dissemination of research for business recovery and resilience.
- Training: Development and delivery of training using rigorous tasksconditions-standards (TCS) in conformance with DOJ Grants Program protocols:
 - Production of a series of "Specialty Awareness" DVDs
 - Advanced Information Sharing Environment Training
- Operational Concepts: Examination of approaches to improving public safety-private sector information sharing environment. Develop "the Library" of "lessons learned" relevant to the private sector.








Prospective Activities (cont'd.)

Training & Technical Assistance

Currently a few hundred are trained annually; tens of thousands need to be trained.

Develop Web-based Training:

- Fusion Liaison Officer Basic Course (National Scope).
- Fusion Liaison Officer Advanced Courses.
