RESUME OF NORMAN PLOTKIN

Norman Plotkin was born in Brooklyn, New York, in 1923. After World War II, he attended U. C. L. A. where he majored in accounting and minored in business administration. He received a Bachelor of Science degree with honors in Accounting in 1948. In 1950 he received a B. F. S. degree cum laude from Georgetown University, School of Foreign Service.

From 1951 to 1964 he worked for both government and private industry. His government experience included positions as Administrative Assistant, Legislative Reference, Department of Agriculture (1952-1954); Disbursing Specialist, State Department, U. S. Embassy in Afghanistan (1962-1963); and Budget Analyst, Department of Commerce (1963-1964). His private industry experience included positions as Cost Accountant, Mergenthaler Linotype Company (1954-1955); Financial Statement Accountant, RCA (1955-1960); and Budget Analyst, Engineering Controller's Office, Curtiss-Wright Corporation (1960-1962).



In 1964 he was awarded a fellowship for graduate study in economics at Claremont Graduate School. In 1965 he received a John C. Lincoln Fellowship and in 1966 the Haynes Foundation Dissertation Research Fellowship. He received his Master of Science degree in Economics in 1966 and his Doctor of Philosophy degree in October 1969. His research was concerned with consumer choice in the public sector.

From 1966 to 1968 he taught economics at Pomona College, Claremont Mens College and Harvey Mudd College. He is a member of the American Economic Association and the Western Economic Association.

He joined the faculty of the Navy Management Systems Center as an Assistant Professor of Economics in August 1969.
