Dr. Paul Wolfowitz, Deputy Secretary of Defense, will speak to students and faculty at the Naval Postgraduate School on Friday, February 22, at 4 p.m. Wolfowitz's talk -- which will focus on the war on terror, defense budget, and defense transformation -- will be open to media.

Wolfowitz was Dean of the The Johns Hopkins University School of Advanced International Studies prior to his appointment last year as the Deputy Secretary of Defense. He has served in previous administrations as Under Secretary of Defense for Policy, U.S. Ambassador to Indonesia, and Assistant Secretary of State for East Asian and Pacific Affairs.
