RESUME OF HARVEY A. DAHL

Harvey A. Dahl was born in Waldheim, Saskatchewan, Canada, in 1926. After serving for almost three years in the United States Army during World War II, he attended Los Angeles City College in Los Angeles, California, majoring first in music and then in physics. After two years he transferred to Stanford University in Palo Alto, California, where he undertook a major in physics and a minor in mathematics. He received the degree of Bachelor of Science in June 1951.



Mr. Dahl continued on as a graduate student in physics at Stanford University, obtaining financial support through employment for four summers at Douglas Aircraft Company, Santa Monica, California, and by working in X-ray research at Stanford for fifteen months before beginning his dissertation project. He completed his dissertation in October, 1962, and received the degree of Doctor of Philosophy from Stanford University in January, 1963. His dissertation research was done in high energy nuclear physics under the direction of Professor Robert Hofstadter.

From October, 1962, until July, 1964, he was employed as a Research Associate in the High Energy Physics Laboratory at Stanford, working on electron scattering research and on the development of improved magnetic spectrometers.

Since July, 1964, he has been employed at the U. S. Naval Postgraduate School at Monterey, California. At present he is an Assistant Professor in the Physics Department. His present principal duty is to teach classes in physics, though he plans to engage in nuclear physics research in due time.

Mr. Dahl is a member of the American Physical Society, the American Association of Physics Teachers, and Sigma Xi.
