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RESUME OF ROLAND WILLIAM GARWOOD

Roland W. Garwood, Jr., was born in Bogotá, Colombia, on 13 April 1945. He attended Bucknell University at Lewisburg, Pennsylvania, where he received the Bachelor of Science degree in Electrical Engineering in 1967. In 1976 he received the Ph.D. in Oceanography from the University of Washington in Seattle.

Between 1965 and 1967 he was employed as an electrical engineer by the U.S. Navy Underwater Sound Laboratory at New London, Connecticut, with assignments in the Anti-Submarine Warfare, Submarine Sonar and Oceanography Divisions.
