PATROL BOAT TO VISIT FOR ARMED FORCES WEEK

A visit by a Navy patrol boat from Special Boat Unit 12 based in San Diego will bring the Armed Forces Week activities to a close. The boat will be open for public visiting from 1300 to 1630, Saturday and Sunday, May 19-20 at the U.S. Coast Guard Pier.

BISWANGER REGATTA

The 14th Annual Biswanger Memorial Regatta will be held this coming Memorial Day weekend, May 26-27.

Hosted by the NPS Sailing Association (NPSSA), the event is the largest match race regatta in Monterey Bay and is also the Navy's West Coast Match Racing Championship.

Races start at 1100 each day and conclude late in the afternoon. The regatta is sailed with 30-foot Shields-class sloops in grueling two-boat match series, similar to the international yacht races for the America's Cup.

Spectators will be able to get a good view of the race from Wharf #2, the Coast Guard pier and Cannery Row.

The military spouse is a unique individual. The wife or husband of any military person often must face raising children by themselves during long separations. Military life also means frequently moving and adjusting to new areas. In recognition of these special people, the Department of Defense has established Military Spouse Day on May 23.
