RESUME OF JOHN EDWARD DAWSON

John Dawson was born in Charles City, Iowa, on 24 March 1932. He attended The Principia College at Elsah, Illinois, where he majored in government and economics. He received the degree of Bachelor of Arts in June 1953.

Graduate study followed at Maxwell School of Citizenship and Public Affairs at Syracuse University, where he received the degree of Master of Public Administration in June 1954. His Ph. D. in Public Administration was received from Maxwell in 1971.

Since June 1954, he has been employed by the U. S. Government in the fields of financial management and program planning. He has worked in the Office of Budget, Office of the Secretary, Department of the Interior; with the Committee on Appropriations, House of Representatives; in the Management Division, Auditor General, Headquarters U. S. Air Force (military 3 years, civilian 2 Years); and as Budget Officer, Bureau of Land Management, Department of the Interior (5 years).

From November 1965 to July 1966, he was a staff assistant, Office of the Under Secretary, Department of the Interior, where he helped implement the Planning-Programming-Budgeting System for that Department. He also has been a consultant to the Office of Management and Budget in the Executive Office of the President; and a consultant to the Director, Congressional Office.

In July 1966 he joined the faculty of the Naval Postgraduate School, Monterey, California, where he is teaching in the Defense Resources Management Education Center. On 21 April 1976 he was appointed Executive Director of the Center.

His major area of interest is public budgeting, especially national budgeting and comparative budgetary systems.
