RESUME OF STEPHEN TRYGVE HOLL

Stephen Holl, United States Navy, was born in Minneapolis, Minnesota, on 10 May 1945. He graduated from high school in Wauwatosa, Wisconsin and attended the United States Naval Academy in Annapolis, Maryland, where he received the degree of Bachelor of Science in June 1967.

Upon graduation from the Naval Academy he reported to the USS HOL-LISTER (DD-788) where he served as main propulsion assistant.

In 1969 he was afforded an opportunity to further his education under the "Burke" program. He enrolled in the Department of Operations Research and Industrial Engineering at The Johns Hopkins University and was awarded the Ph. D. in June 1974. His thesis work was in the area of linear programming with multiple objective functions.

In September 1973 he attended the department head course at the U. S. Naval Destroyer School in Newport, Rhode Island. The following summer he reported to the USS RICHARD L. PAGE (DEG-5) where he served as Engineer Officer.

In August 1976 he reported to the Naval Postgraduate School, Monterey, California, where he is teaching in the Computer Science Department.

He is a member of the U. S. Naval Institute and an associate member of the Operations Research Society of America and of the Institute of Management Science.
